

What to expect from NH schools and districts during the pandemic:

Options for families with concerns

Sometimes families may feel out of the loop with school and district decision-making. It is important that families know that the goal of the school district is not to keep them out of the process and that decisions are often based on the safety of everyone. The local school board is empowered under statute to make such determinations. Because parent input is important, the NH Department of Education is providing options for how to handle concerns.

With whom should I raise concerns?

It is always best to try to resolve any concerns you may have with your child's teacher. If still dissatisfied, you can then proceed to the next in the chain of command at your school and district until satisfied (see graphic at right).

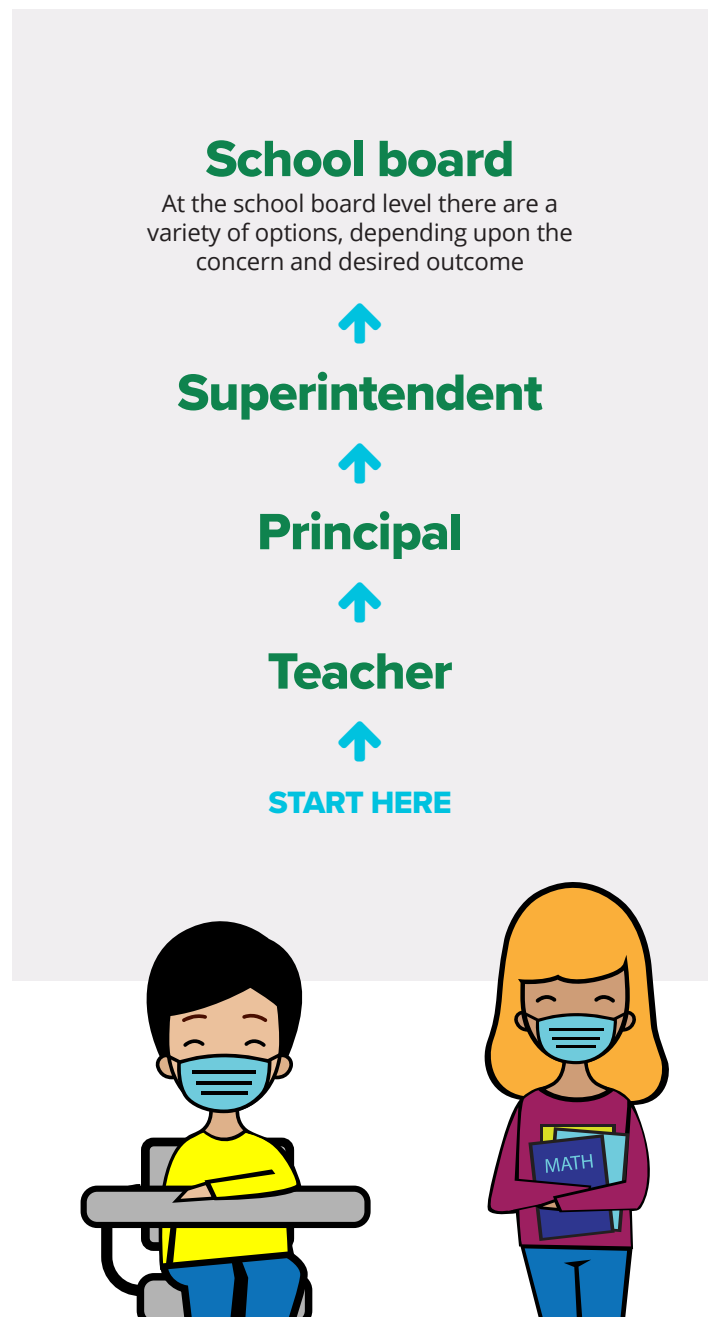
Ask yourself: Is there a way to resolve problems or make adjustments that would make me more comfortable with the decision?

What should I say?

It is important to remember to maintain focus by letting the person know:

- ✓ This is my concern
- ✓ This is why it's a concern
- ✓ This is what I want you to do to address my concern

Be specific and focused on solutions. A specific resolution may not be possible for a variety of reasons. Be prepared to offer alternatives that would help to resolve the issue.
