



Through SBVI, VR New Hampshire provides an array of supports to help people who are blind or vision impaired earn, learn, and live life to the fullest. Central to these are *VR services*.

About SBVI VR Services

If you're a New Hampshire resident who is blind or vision impaired, you may be eligible for VR services from SBVI.

Our VR services—like those offered by VR New Hampshire to people with *all* types of disabilities—can transform your life by helping you prepare for, obtain, and succeed in a meaningful career. But they also take into account needs that may be specific to people who are blind or vision impaired. For instance, depending on your individual circumstances, SBVI VR services may include training on:



Alternative ways to accomplish tasks



Computer use and communication



How to use assistive technology and digital accessibility features



Travel, orientation, and mobility



Other independent living skills

Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) Services

SBVI can also help currently employed individuals who are losing vision due to injury, illness, or aging learn about tools and strategies that can help them keep working for as long as desired.

Additional Services SBVI also:



Provides pre-employment training services for youth who are blind or vision impaired

Maintains New
Hampshire's Blindness
Registry, which entitles
people to benefits ranging
from tax deductions to
educational opportunities
