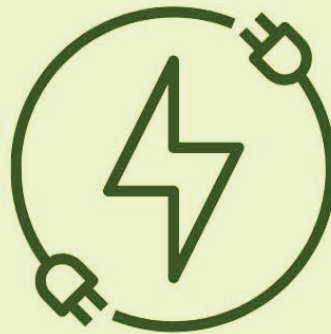


HOW TO BECOME AN ELECTRICIAN

Ability to work alone and as a group

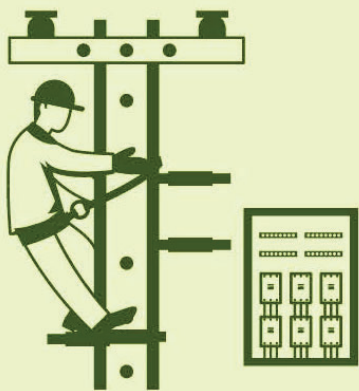

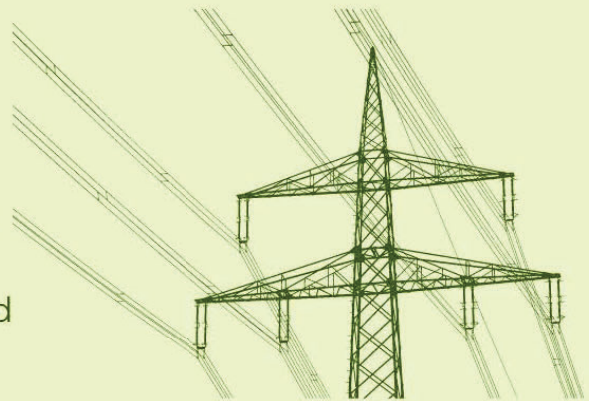

12th Grade you would transition into a Registered Apprenticeship

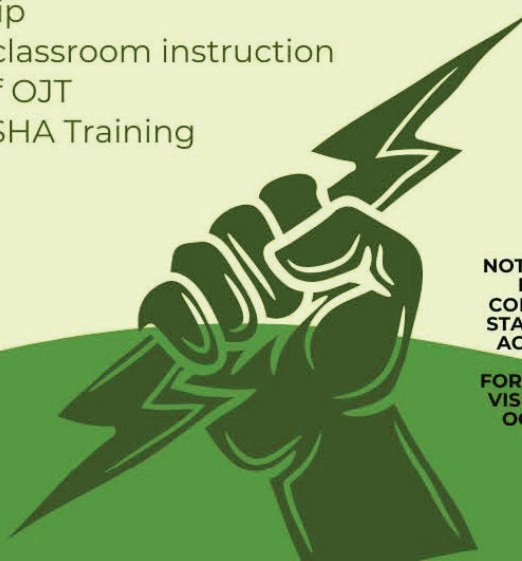
