Amounts listed by State for Impact Aid Construction under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act are formula grants only. An additional \$59,400,000, included in the Undistributed (non-State allocations) line, is available to LEAs under the competitive grants portion of the program.

Recovery Act funds for Pell Grants are included with fiscal year 2009 allocations.

Due to an administrative error in fiscal years 2003 through 2008, 23 States did not receive their full allocations.
The FY 2010 estimates reflect a one-time request for additional funds to correct the underpayments.
No corrective action would be taken with respect to overpayments.
