- The Bureau of Career Development at NHED is announcing the release of a request for applications (RFA) to provide a funding opportunity to address costs associated with transporting high school students to programs at regional Career and Technical Education (CTE) centers. - The U.S. Department of Energy is offering the 2024 Renew America's Schools Prize. This 3phase, \$180 million opportunity will help K-12 public school districts across the U.S. build
 capacity, perform energy audits, and plan/implement energy improvement projects across a
 portfolio of school facilities. The 2024 prize will focus on schools that serve disadvantaged
 communities, including those with a high percentage of students eligible for free and
 reduced-price lunch.
- Chess in Education-US is hosting its **Granite Gambit Professional Development** for 2024. - NHED's Bureau of Special Education Support has issued an <u>online survey</u> to obtain input on the NH Special Education Information System (NHSEIS) from staff using the information

system to enter student data for IDEA and state requirements in special education. NHED values your input on the usability of and satisfaction with NHSEIS.

- NHED's Office of Social and Emotional Wellness has partnered with One Trusted Adult to
 offer <u>free resources</u> to support school connectedness and community building in NH middle

- NHED will be posting its annual **Indoor Air Quality (IAQ)** survey online in the coming weeks. It is expected, when the survey is posted, that an email from the Facilities Inspector (Marlon Austin) will follow, documenting the processes involved in completing the survey, answers to frequently asked questions, and the due date of June 30.
- The <u>Threat Evaluation & Reporting Overview</u> is a 3-hour introductory training focusing on a behavioral approach to violence prevention. This presentation is available for New Hampshire schools.
- The New Hampshire Bureau of Adult Education has partnered with YouScience to create the
 Pathways to High School Completion Resource Guide. It provides guidance to counselors,
 parents, and students in navigating the various opportunities for earning high school
 credentials and post-secondary planning. The May 20 webinar will break down the different
 sections of the guide and describe the different options that are available to students, such as
 adult education, high school equivalency testing, and career and technical education. Register

- All End-of-Year (EOY) submissions are live in i4see.

The EOY three submissions must be batch verified by June 26, verified by July 9 and certified no later than July 10:

- o EOY Enrollment required for all districts and charters
- o EOY Free and Reduced required for all districts and charters
- Home School Academic required for districts that had home school students participate in courses in the public school(s).

The following five submissions must be batch verified by July 31, district verified by Aug. 12 and certified no later than Aug. 14:

- College and Career Readiness high schools only
- Credits and GPA high schools only
- Extended Learning Opportunities high schools only
- EOY Academic Performance Targeted Title I schools only

If your district has no data to submit for any of the submissions listed above, you will still need to certify the empty submission.

The <u>UNH Tech for Teachers Institute</u> is a dynamic, paid **professional development** program

program is two-fold: Building knowledge of an emerging technology—this year regenerative
medicine and biofabrication—and the transformation of instructional practice through

Durham campus. Upon completion, participants will receive a \$1,500 award, CEUs, classroom supplies and ongoing support from UNH faculty and graduate students.
