This **grant** will allow NH public and public charter schools to receive funding for Science of Reading evidence-based, high-quality literacy curriculum to support students in K-6. ARP EANS funds this competitive grant, and all GEER II program assurances are applied. The estimated budget for each proposal is \$5,000 to \$25,000. Funds must be properly obligated by September 30, 2024.
