- In an effort to bolster **civics education** throughout the Granite State, NHED is <u>partnering</u> with Discovery Education to support the development of informed students who are eager and ready to participate in democracy.
- In just three months, NHED has disbursed \$1.1 million in scholarships so that 1,777 Granite
 State children can attend camp this summer and improve their overall well-being. Federal
 Covid-relief funding is still available for our RekINDling Curiosity program please spread the

- The New Hampshire Excellence in Education (EDies) board would like to congratulate its 2024 School of Excellence winners. Warren Village School has been nominated for the title of 2024 K-12 School of Excellence. This nomination comes as a recognition of the school's unwavering commitment to academic excellence, community engagement and historic preservation.
 Bethlehem Elementary School has been named the 2024 Elementary School of Excellence in New Hampshire by the EDies board. This honor highlights the school's commitment to fostering academic excellence, innovation in instruction and the creation of a vibrant and inclusive learning environment.

- The 4th Annual **Assistive Technology Expo** will take place next month. - Today is the deadline for NHED's <u>Leaning Into Literacy II Resource Grant</u>. This grant will allow NH public and public charter schools to receive funding for Science of Reading evidencebased, high-quality literacy curriculum to support students in K-6. ARP EANS funds this competitive grant, and all GEER II program assurances are applied. The estimated budget for each proposal is \$5,000 to \$25,000. Funds must be properly obligated by September 30, 2024.
- The 10th Annual **School Resource Officer Conference** will be held Aug. 12-13 in Pembroke. The two-day event is designed for school resource officers and school safety professionals. Register here.
