- This week, NHED issued a <u>technical advisory</u> that provides guidance to schools on what actions constitute **electioneering** by public employees, which is prohibited by RSA 659:44-a.
- In partnership with NHED, the <u>Data Science 4 Everyone</u> team invites you to a free summit on Oct. 23 ahead of the ATMNE Mathematics Conference. The summit, from 5-7 p.m. at the Sheraton Hotel in Nashua, will be dedicated to catalyzing the enthusiasm around **data science education** as the region continues to explore implementation options. It will include updates from each New England state about their milestones in Data Science Education. Complete this registration form by Oct. 10.
- USNH institutions are working collaboratively to create a statewide support framework
  for new teachers, including those with site-based licensing plans. One step in this
  support for districts is the creation of both credit-bearing and noncredit-bearing
  pathways to satisfy the Professional Education Requirements. Planning for the launch of
  these 2-credit courses at Keene State and Plymouth State University is underway with
  expected availability in spring 2025.

- In order to advance student achievement, NHED is seeking approval from the U.S. Department of Education to waive pursuant to Section 8401 of the ESEA of 1965, the period of availability of consolidated administrative funds in Section 421(b) of the General Education Provisions Act to extend the period of availability for ARP administrative funds and FY 2022 ESEA program administrative funds consolidated under ESEA section 8201 to March 31, 2026. - One World Language School provides Spanish, French, German and Mandarin Chinese instruction for students. - The College of Professional Studies at UNH has added six Professional Development Units to its existing noncredit-bearing offerings that meet the Professional Education Requirements for all teaching licensures. These four-week units include on-site coaching from Center for Educator Preparation faculty, and may be used to satisfy the Professional Education requirements on teachers' SBLPs. - NHED is partnering with Khan Academy to offer Khanmigo for educators and students in grades 5-12 statewide. Khanmigo, an Al platform, serves as a teaching assistant for educators and a tutor for students. School administrators are encouraged to visit Khanmigo for New Hampshire to initiate the free contracting process.
- NHED's <u>UpGrade</u> program aims to increase the number of <u>educators earning tech</u> <u>credentials</u>, as well as encourage existing technology leaders to receive educator endorsements to teach computer science and similar tech courses. For existing educators, NHED will reimburse the cost of any exams or licensure costs for qualified credentials, up to a total of \$2,000. In addition, teachers will receive a stipend for each credential acquired, up to a total of \$750.
